Directions:

If you are honouring a Survivor of Indian Residential Schools:





- 1. select a Residential School Survivor and listen to their story
- 2. next, design a tile with any image, word or a combination of images and words that you want to use to honour and respect a survivor of the Indian Residential Schools
- 3. choose a colour (anything but black or white) and colour the edges of your tile
- 4. clearly print the name of the survivor and the name of the school they attended on the back of the tile

If you are creating a memorial for a child who died in residential school:

- 1. use Google to search for and learn details about a child who has passed
- 2. now, design a tile with any image, word or a combination of images and words that you want to use to honour, respect and commemorate a child who attended an Indian Residential School
- 3. colour the edges of your tile black
- 4. clearly print the name of the child and the school they attended on the back of the tile

In addition, provide a thoughtful and thorough 250-word description of your tile explaining your design and colour choice.
